Working together to overcome the Coronavirus Pandemic

As we continue to adapt to our new reality in health care and life in general, the team at the Brant Community Healthcare System (BCHS) is here for you, providing safe, high-quality care.

BCHS leadership, frontline teams and support staff at both Brantford General Hospital and The Willett have been working non-stop to plan and be ready to manage the pandemic locally. Extensive planning at Brantford General has resulted in expanded capacity and clinicians are ready to deal with a potential surge in the number of patients diagnosed with COVID-19.

BCHS has also refurbished, repaired and re-tooled medical equipment and outfitted spaces to expand services and areas, with the construction of additional negative pressure rooms and more treatment spaces to safely treat highly infectious patients and many other patients.

Through this work, BCHS has identified a need for patient equipment to be purchased immediately – equipment that had been identified for purchase over the longer term but is now more urgent to help address an influx of possible COVID-19 cases. Equipment such as ventilators, pulse oximetry units, portable ventilators, code carts and patient monitors have all been identified by BCHS with a request that the Foundation assist with covering the costs for many of the items.

Community support is so important during these challenging times and the Foundation is relying on the continued support and generosity of our donors. We are ever grateful for your support which ultimately helps BCHS deliver exceptional care to all patients.

The Foundation's COVID-19 Fund is designed to attract donations to help BCHS respond quickly during the crisis by acquiring equipment and supplies for emerging needs. Every dollar raised through the fund will help provide health care staff with the right tools and necessary spaces needed to care for patients safely even as things change from day to day.

We at the Foundation are amazed by the many individuals and companies who have stepped up especially during the pandemic to provide an outpouring of support to BCHS staff, physicians and patients. Equipment Spotlight

Ventilator

The BCHS Foundation recently invested over \$100,000 to purchase two ventilators for our Critical Care Unit at the Brant Community Healthcare System. This vital piece of medical equipment is designed to mechanically move breathable air into and out of the lungs. It provides the mechanism of breathing for a patient that is physically unable to breathe, or breathing insufficiently. In addition to the COVID-19 crisis, the need for ventilators has increased due to our aging population, more ill patients being cared for in the hospital for longer periods of time, with some patients remaining on a ventilator for many months.



Cough Assist

The cough assist machine is a non-invasive machine that helps to clear secretions from the lungs by simulating a natural deep cough. Positive air pressure is applied to obtain a large volume of air in the lungs. The device then quickly reverses the flow of air by shifting to negative pressure simulating a cough.

This equipment is used by our Respiratory Therapists to optimize longer term patients with a tracheotomy both on and off ventilators. The BCHS Foundation recently invested over \$5,000 towards the purchase of this life saving piece of equipment.

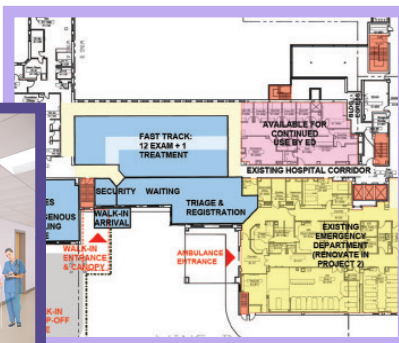

Emergency Care at the Brantford General Hospital

Now more than ever before we understand and have a new appreciation about the importance of our health care system and the people who are working to keep us healthy and safe. The Emergency Department is an important asset within local health care used to treat serious illnesses and life-threatening injuries.

The provincial government has approved a plan to renovate and expand the Brantford General Hospital Emergency Department, which has moved BCHS to the next stage of the project. The province does not cover the entire cost of the project which means the BCHS Foundation must raise funds to cover the remaining costs for the renovation along with new or replacement hospital equipment to be used for patient care in the new space.

The Brant Community Healthcare System Foundation fundraising goal is more than \$7 million to support this exciting project which includes the purchase of a new CT scanner – one of the most often used pieces of technology at BCHS.



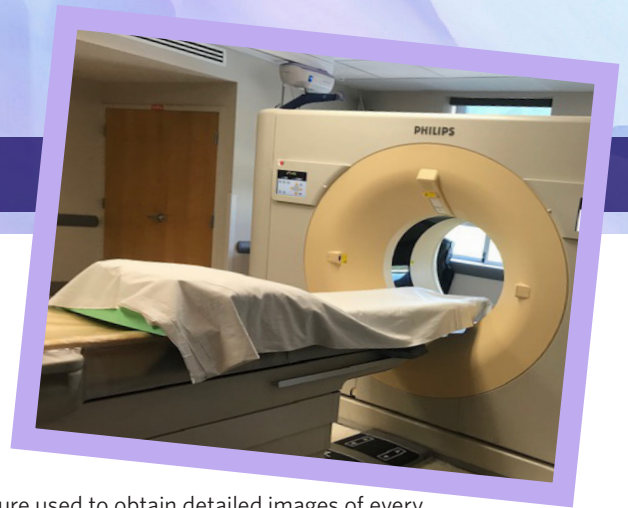
Did you know?

- Last year, BCHS saw over 58,000 Emergency Department (ED) visits.
- The Emergency Department is responsible for up to 69% of all patient admissions to the BCHS.

CT Technology

an ongoing need at the BCHS



The Brant Community Healthcare System (BCHS) currently has one CT unit that is nearing end of life. Excessive demand has increased wear and tear on the system resulting in increased downtime. The need to replace the existing CT unit as well as install a second unit has been identified as a top priority.

What is CT technology?

Computed Tomography – CT – scanning is a highly specialized x-ray imaging procedure used to obtain detailed images of every area in the body, providing information that no other imaging device can get. Modern CT scanners are a valuable tool that have revolutionized the diagnosis and treatment for trauma, cancer, stroke, infection and many other conditions.

Investing in CT is vital for BCHS to maintain a high level of quality health care to the community and support expanding clinical services.

Did you know?

- 56% of the volume on the CT unit results from patients being treated in the Emergency Department and within BCHS each day.
- Two biopsies are performed using the CT unit per day to support the Brant Community Cancer Clinic with advances in cancer care including increased follow up and staging exams.
- BCHS operates as the District Stroke Centre for the Brant Haldimand and Norfolk geographical region. The Integrated Stroke Unit (ISU) is a specialized unit with inter-professional teams of care providers who have advanced knowledge, training and expertise in stroke care. Multiple CT scans are performed each day to diagnose strokes and ensure critical access to care.

Our community has risen to the challenge and responded with much kindness and philanthropic spirit to help us:

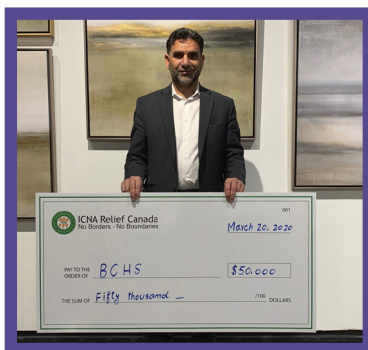
- Establish the COVID-19 Fund to respond to critical pandemic needs
