

CT Technology at Brant Community Healthcare System



Computed Tomography -CT - scanning is a highly specialized x-ray imaging procedure used to obtain detailed images of every area in the body, providing information no other imaging device can get. Modern CT Scanners are an incredibly valuable tool that have

revolutionized the diagnosis and treatment of trauma, cancer, stroke, infection and many other conditions.

Q and **A** - An Interview with Dr. Angela Fleming, **Chief and Medical Director Diagnostic Imaging**

Q: What role do you play at BCHS and why are you proud to be part of the BCHS Family?

A: I am a staff radiologist at BGH, working here since 2005. I am also the Chief and Medical Director of our department since Jan. 2021. I am proud to be a part of the BCHS family as I truly believe, despite limited material resources, that we have fantastic people resources. Whether it be the physicians, nurses, technologists, or ESAs, our staff are resilient, resourceful and caring. So many of us work and live in Brantford and have a vested interest in the health and welfare of our community. Brant is a wonderful place to live and raise your family.

Q: How will the purchase of a second CT Scanner make a difference for our community?

A second CT scanner will allow us to image more patients in a more timely fashion. A second CT scanner will allow for some redundancy in our system when the scanner undergoes what we call preventative maintenance, or when a scanner undergoes unexpected repairs. Currently, CT imaging and CT guided procedures have to be deferred when our single CT is down for maintenance or repairs, or patients have to be sent out of town, both of which impact patient care. We will be able to do more biopsies and CT guided procedures with a second scanner. Currently, we limit the number of such procedures we do daily, as we can only use the scanner for one thing at a time. As a result, outpatients may wait longer for their lung biopsy. With a second scanner, we would be able to do more procedures, without compromising our ability to image patients for diagnosis and treatment monitoring.



Did you Know

- The CT currently performs 50,000 scans per year
- Since the installation of the current CT in 2010, the volume/demand has increased 200%
- 45% of the volume on the CT results from ED patient visits
- Two biopsies per day are performed using the CT to support the Brant Community Cancer Clinic

Brant Community Healthcare System (BCHS) currently has one CT unit that is nearing the end of life. Excessive demand has increased wear and tear on the system resulting in increased downtime.





Q: How does Diagnostic Imaging and the CT Scanner make a difference to patient care at BCHS?

A: 30 to 40 years ago, Diagnostic Imaging (DI) was a very different specialty than it is now. In the past, radiology was a 9 to 5 sort of job - our department now runs 24/7. At any given time, we will have anywhere from 2 to 20 technologists working and anywhere from 1 to 7 radiologists working. With technological advances, there is not an aspect of medicine that is not part of DI. Whether it be imaging for diagnosis, imaging for procedure guidance, or imaging to assess treatment response, DI is essential in today's medicine for patient care. This becomes extremely evident when we unfortunately have downtimes due to equipment failure. In these instances, flow of patients, particularly the ED and the inpatient units are severely impacted. When our CT needs repairing, patients from the ED have to be re routed with a nurse to other hospitals for their imaging, as often they cannot wait the time it takes for the machine to be repaired. Our CT scanner is one of the busiest in our region, with roughly 50% of all scans coming from the ED and inpatients in hospital.
